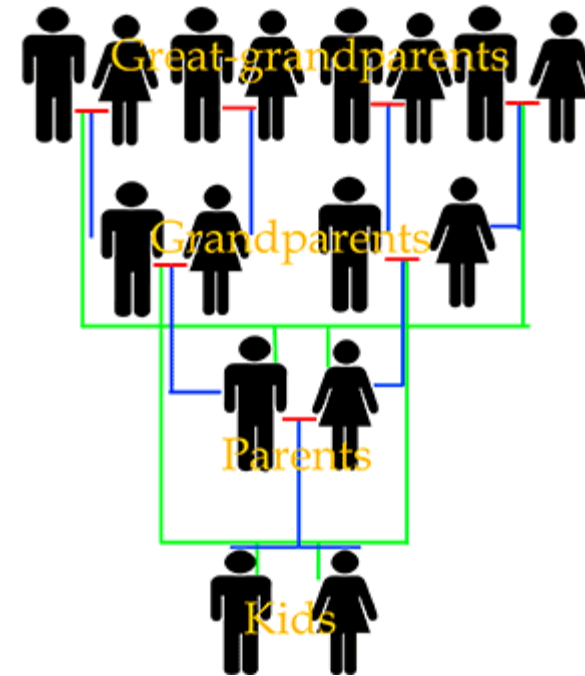

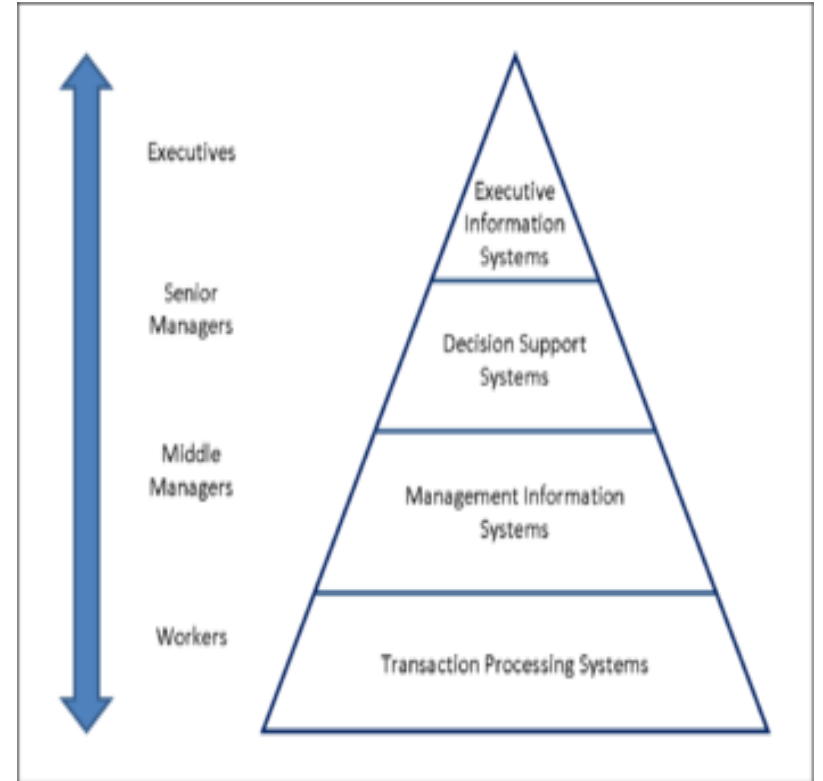

Posing with one of the nation's most easily recognizable symbols of white supremacy and racial oppression as a lark — especially when there are ongoing protests against police brutality and institutional racism across the country — is seriously questionable. And, the mother of one of the boys told Fox31 that parents were encouraging the kids to ham it up with the flag and the guns. "There were other parents there fully supporting it and taking pictures," she said.

Could a 1968 report have prevented riots in Baltimore and Ferguson?

“What white Americans have never fully understood — but what the Negro (sic) can never forget — is that white society is deeply implicated in the ghetto. White institutions created it, white institutions maintain it, and white society condones it.”

The report said blacks were burdened by overt discrimination, high unemployment, poor schools, inadequate housing, lack of adequate health care, systematic police bias and brutality, and the corrosive impact of chronic poverty.

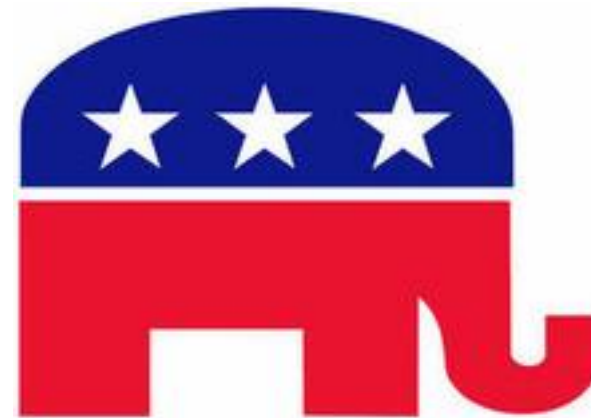


Divided we Fall

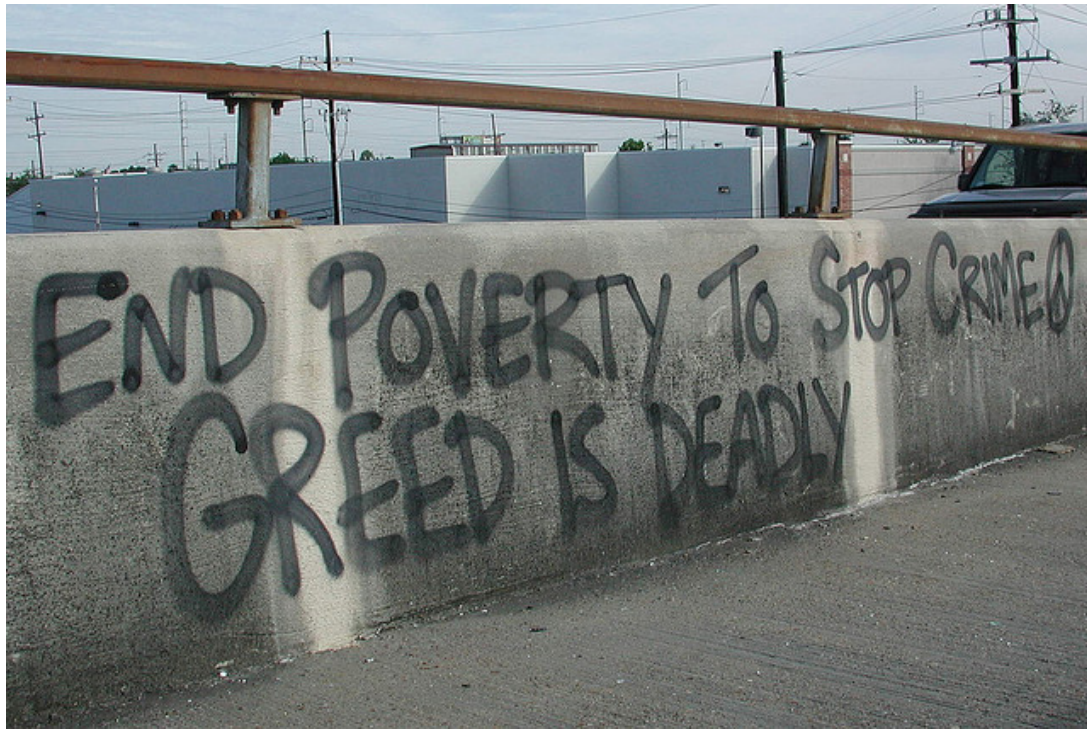
